Air Travel

Car Travel

Comming from the south of Germany traveling in direction Berlin (beltway west). Change from beltway to A24 direction Hamburg/Rostock for 60km. At the junction Wittstock/Dosse change from A24 onto the A19 in direction Wittstock, Rostock via A19. Follow the A19 to the end were a tunnel will be joining the citymotorway to Warnemünde. There you will have to use the ferry to the Yachthafen. If you like to avoid the tunnel (MAUT/taxes) leave A19 at the junction to A20 in the direction to Hamburg approximately 10 km ahead Rostock. Than you will have to leave the A20 at Rostock-West to join the citymotorway to Warnemünde.
